South West Ambulance Service Charity- Community Responder Vehicle Appeal

Community responders are literally a lifeline for rural communities- saving crucial minutes in providing vital care to our ill and injured. This appeal aims to provide a brand new fully equipped rapid response vehicle to each of the areas covered by South West Ambulance, one of which is Gloucestershire.

Severn Area Rescue Association (SARA)

SARA are our local lifeboat and inland search and rescue organisation. They cover the area from Newport to Kidderminster to Cirencester, on land and water, from seven rescue stations. They are staffed entirely by volunteers, and are funded purely from donations.

St John's, Purton- Roof Restoration project- a message from Peter Bennett, committee member

The roof of the attractive little church in Purton is in decay and is dire need of replacement, estimated to cost more than £100,000.

The opportunity will be taken to improve St Johns environmental footprint by incorporating solar panels which will supply all its energy needs.

The local community has got behind the project and has raised about a third of what is required so far by putting on a variety of fund-raising events: church teas, village breakfasts, quiz nights, tapas & music nights, and a Harvest Festival supper. But we still have a long way to go, and we are very grateful for support from the Berkeley Soapbox '25 event.

Public Safety Message

Soapbox racing carries risks for both participants and spectators, and vehicles on our course may reach 30 km/h. The organisers have taken every reasonable precaution to prevent injury, but you enter the course at your own risk.

You must follow the instructions of the designated marshals (who will be wearing yellow tabards) at all times. Whistles will be used to warn you prior to each kart descent. Karts will not be allowed to travel whilst spectators are on the course.

You must keep behind the ropes and barriers at all times and all children below the age of 16 years must be accompanied by a responsible adult. **Dogs must be kept on a lead**. You may only cross the course at designated crossing points.

Toilet facilities are available as indicated on the map (please be respectful to those who might be using them after you). Please respect the venue and use the bins provided or take all your rubbish home with you.
